#### Westy BBQ & Parade



# Electronic Payment Changes



#### Moving Money Faster with Same Day ACH



Changes in the rules for Automated Clearing House (ACH) are taking effect as of September 15, 2017. Due to these changes, virtually all types of electronic payments (excluding debit card transactions), for both deposits and payments are now eligible to be processed on the same day that they are originated. This will speed up the payment system, which has great benefit when you are receiving a payment, but also means that when you are making a payment, it will now clear your account sooner.

#### Examples are the following:

- 1. **Same-day payrolls** supports business' needs to pay hourly workers, and provides flexibility for late and emergency payrolls and missed deadlines; and enables employees to have faster access to their pay
- 2. **Business-to-Business payments** enables faster settlement of invoice payments between trading partners, and includes remittance information with the payments.
- Expedited bill payments enables consumers to make on time bill payments on due dates and provides faster crediting for late payments.
- Account-to-Account transfers provides faster crediting for consumers who move money between various accounts they own.

#### What does this mean to you?

**Make sure funds are available** in your account for payments you make online or via telephone to avoid incurring overdraft and return fees. Float times will be greatly reduced, *if not eliminated altogether!* If you have any questions, please contact our operations department at 785-457-3316.

#### **Lemon Pound Cake**

#### Ingredients:

- 1 box Lemon cake mix
- 1 package instant lemon pudding/pie filling 4 eggs
- 1 Cup water
- 1/3 Cup vegetable oil

Combine all ingredients in large bowl. Beat for 2 minutes with electric mixer. Grease and flour bundt pan. Pour mixture into pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 50 minutes. Turn onto serving plate. Cool and then sprinkle with powdered sugar.

#### **Creamy Dill Cucumber Salad**

#### Ingredients:

1 - 1 1/2 pounds cucumbers, sliced 1/2 medium purple onion, thinly sliced

#### DRESSING:

1 TBS fresh or frozen dill, chopped 3/4 Cup sour cream

1/2 TBS fresh lemon juice (from 1/2 small lemon)

1 large or 2 small garlic cloves, pressed 1/2 tsp sea salt or pinch of black pepper to taste

Place the cucumbers and onions in a large bowl. Set aside. In a bowl, whisk together all dressing ingredients. Pour over cucumbers and onions. Toss to coat. Chill about 2 hours before serving.



#### FDIC INSURANCE COVERAGE



We often receive questions regarding FDIC insurance coverage. It is important to know that the standard deposit insurance amount is \$250,000 per depositor, per insured bank, for each account ownership category. Retirement accounts are separately insured to \$250,000.

If you are interested in knowing if your deposits are fully insured, or just learning more about FDIC Insurance, visit the FDIC's Electronic Deposit Insurance Estimator (EDIE) at www.fdic.gov/edie. EDIE is an online tool that allows users to input dollar amounts for each bank that a customer has deposits at and calculates the amount of insurance coverage. This works for personal, business and government accounts. EDIE is also a great tool to determine if you can deposit more money at a particular insured bank. There is also a section for frequently asked questions about deposit insurance.
