### **SUMMER TIME IS HERE!**

Summer is here and whether you are traveling, going to school, hanging out at the pool, or even working, you can count on FSB being right there for you.

That's right! Even though we won't be there physically, we will be there through the variety of services we offer. We want to make sure you never have to worry about your money and you have access to your accounts any time, any day.

Here are a few of the services we offer that we hope you will take advantage of if you haven't already!

MOBILE BANKING - You can check account balances, look at transaction history, transfer money between accounts, and pay bills. You can even deposit checks without coming to the bank - contact us to see if you are eligible for mobile deposit.

CARD SERVICES - Many of our card services are found within our mobile app. You can set up alerts and receive transaction notifications, set controls on where, when, and how your card is used, add travel plans, set up fraud alerts, report lost or stolen debit cards, set up spending limits, and easily add cards to your mobile wallet. In the *Card on File* menu, you will find merchant contact information and easily locate which merchants have your card information stored and see if recurring payments are setup. The *Spend Insights* menu lets you view how your card is being used. This is a great tool for budgeting, as it summarizes into charts what, when, and where you are using your card. Apple Pay, Google Pay, and

Samsung Pay can also be set up via our app.

<u>E-STATEMENTS</u> - You can do away with all those paper statements and have them sent directly to you just by signing up for e-statements. Visit online banking to sign up today.

<u>FSB ATMs/ALLPOINT ATMs</u> - If you cannot make it to one of our local FSB ATMs, find an Allpoint ATM - download the app or visit www.allpointnetwork.com. Being a part of the Allpoint Network allows you to withdrawal cash at Allpoint ATMs all around the world without being charged a fee!



If you are traveling, remember to add a travel alert to your debit card through the mobile app or by calling one of our locations with the dates you are traveling and destination. If our fraud department suspects something suspicious, you might receive a text notification or phone call.

So wherever you go this summer - ENJOY IT - and remember you can always take us with you, even if it's only digitally!

## **DID YOU KNOW?**

True or False: You should open and review your monthly bank statement when you receive it?



TRUE! It is a good habit to check your accounts on a regular basis, however, if you are unable to do so, you should at least check your monthly bank statement.

This is the best way to catch and stop unauthorized transactions. Any unauthorized transactions on your account must be reported within 60 days of the date the statement is issued to you. This includes paper and e-statements. If you don't report it, you may end up being liable for unauthorized transactions.

## INDUSTRY NEWS

#### Check Scams

Scamming customers out of their money continues to be a big market for fraudsters. They are constantly looking for new ways to scam people and exploit current events. Common ways to scam include phone calls, e-mail and text messages, social media requests, and the good ol' check.

<u>Fake check scams</u> involve an individual receiving a check to pay for employment expenses, supplies, secret shopper duties, etc. <u>Overpayment check scams</u> involve an individual receiving a check with extra funds included and are asked to return the extra funds, possibly by a wire transfer or gift card purchases. In both instances, whether the check was expected or not, the checks are deposited and the individual spends the funds. Meanwhile, the check is returned as fraud and the individual is left with the loss.

## BIF COMMERCIAL PRODUCER OF THE YEAR

The annual Beef Improvement Federation (BIF) Commercial Producer of the Year award was presented to an area cattle operation on June 2nd at BIF's 54th Annual Symposium and Convention in Las Cruces, New Mexico.

Rezac Land & Livestock was recognized for their dedication to improving the beef industry at the commercial level with their cow-calf operation.

Rezac Land & Livestock, which is located south of Onaga, on the northern edge of the Flint Hills, was founded by Don and Barbara Rezac. In 1986, their sons, Jay and Lance, formed a partnership with 125 cows and a couple hundred head of feeder cattle. Today the operation includes six partners and is a family affair.

The Rezacs operate a diversified crop and cattle operation, with the cattle operation being their main focus. The cattle operation consists of 900 Simmental and Angus bred spring-calving cows. Once the calves are weaned, they are either sold or shipped to a commercial feed yard or finished in the family-owned feed yard. The cows graze on native grass, stalks, and cover crops year-round. By following a strict grazing management plan, the Rezacs can maintain their cows with limited supplementation, while keeping their natural resources in excellent condition.

They also purchase, feed, and sell about 5,500 calves each year for their stocker and backgrounding operation with the majority being sold as feeder cattle.

The Rezac family is actively involved in the Onaga community and agricultural organizations. We appreciate their dedication to the cattle industry and congratulate them on this award!

## TECH CORNER

#### Public Wi-Fi Use

Wi-Fi hotspots in airports, hotels, restaurants, coffee shops, libraries, and other public places are convenient, but are usually not secure. Using an unsecure Wi-Fi network could allow someone else to see the information you are sending and could open up the possibility of your identity being stolen or you being scammed.

While you can keep your home wireless network secure with strong router passwords, limiting device access and firewalls, you can't do that with public Wi-Fi. However, you can still try to keep your data secure with some of the following tips.

- ⇒ Do not access your personal or financial information on public Wi-Fi.
- ⇒ Set your settings to not automatically connect to Wi-Fi.
- ⇒ Consider using a virtual private network (VPN) app that offers encryption.
- ⇒ Keep your browser and software up-to-date.
- ⇒ Use your mobile data to ensure that you are not connected to a network with other users.

## **MOBILE SECURITY TIPS**

Having technology at your fingertips is great, but there are potential threats that come with that technology. Below are a few tips that can protect your mobile devices and yourself.

- Use strong passwords. Use passwords that are difficult for someone to guess. Use different passwords for different devices. Do not allow your device to remember passwords.
- \* Keep software up-to-date. Install updates for apps and your device when they are available. Keeping software updated helps prevent attackers from being able to take advantage of device vulnerabilities.
- \* **Guard your device.** Never leave your device unattended in a public place and lock it when it is not is use.
- \* Know your apps. Be sure you understand the details of an app before you download and install it. Some apps request access to your location and personal information. Delete apps that you do not use frequently.
- \* **Set up alert notifications.** Set up alerts to notify you about account transactions.
